hereby agree that the enclosed Standard Material Transfer Agreement (SMTA) shall be applicable for the transfer of Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture other than those listed in Annex I of the International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture¹ (hereinafter referred to as „Treaty”).

For this reason, the following interpretation of the SMTA shall be agreed upon:

1. The references in the SMTA to the „Multilateral System“ shall not be interpreted as limiting the application of the SMTA to Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture listed in Annex I of the Treaty.
2. While Non-Annex I material distributed with the enclosed SMTA does not become part of the Multilateral System, it will however be available under the same conditions.
3. In particular in the case of Article 6.2, Article 6.5 b) and Article 6.10 of the SMTA „Multilateral System“ shall be taken to mean „under this agreement”.
4. The reference in Article 6.11 and Annex 3 of the SMTA to „Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture belonging to the same crop, as set out in Annex I of the Treaty“ shall be taken to mean „Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture belonging to the same crop“.
